Tree Trimming Time and Clean Out Time?

Almost Too Late Now!!

Unless you have already taken advantage of that **clear weather to trim foliage and clean out underbrush...** Caution! In February, baby squirrels are already starting to appear in wildlife rescue facilities due to trimming trees that contain nests. Great Horned owlets and **Anna's hummingbirds will be hatching next month** as well, so leave the half rotted trees, they are home to cavity dwellers like owls. Remember, rodents are their favorite dish!

As soon as March **marches in...** trimming time is over!!

And don't forget to clean out your song bird boxes to make room for new twigs and nesting material soon to come.
